Students who have reached academic competence in English or if English is their first language, or who feel that they are eligible for a TOEFL score waiver must complete and submit a TOEFL Score Waiver Form (provided in the application package). Students should note that students who complete the waiver form may be denied their petition for language accommodations during examinations.

Mandatory Course Load for Exchange Students	 i.e. minimum number of courses students have to take. Is there any flexibility here? Degree-seeking students (F-1) are required to make <i>normal progress toward their degree</i> and must complete 8 or more units each term for immigration purposes. Non-degree students (J-1) are required to enroll in <i>the standard prescribed course of study for US students</i> which is 12 or more units. Both degree-seeking students (F-1) and non-degree students (J-1) have the flexibility to enroll in more units than the minimum number required. If an individual student is experiencing academic or personal difficulty they may arrange an individual consultation with the Global Engagement Office (geo@scu.edu) to request the possibility of enrolling in less than the minimum requirement.
