meeting.

All proposed topics must be confirmed. You will receive a message by e-
mail (which may include modifications of the title and the topic), usually
within one week after you have submitted your proposal.

- Presentations: Tuesday, December 15, 2015, 9:00am – 6:00pm, Sem 51.
- ⇒ Presentation: 10 minutes (maximum of 15 minutes).
Please do not present all the details of your seminar paper. Please present and discuss only the key issues of your seminar paper topic.
 - ⇒ Attendance is obligatory.
 - ⇒ The seminar paper must be turned in by e-mail to siegfried.fina@univie.ac.at by Tuesday, December 8, 2015, prior to giving the oral presentation.
- Grading: Seminar paper and oral presentation.
- The seminar paper must be submitted electronically as a Word document by e-mail to siegfried.fina@univie.ac.at. Master degree students (DiplomandInnen) must submit, in addition, a paper copy of the final seminar paper, together with the completed master thesis grading form (Formular zur Approbation als Diplomandenseminararbeit) and the signed Best Scientific Practices form (Regeln der guten wissenschaftlichen Praxis).
- Citation: Please use the citation rules according to the Austrian AZR or the U.S. Bluebook (<http://www.law.cornell.edu/citation>) or the Oxford Standard for the Citation of Legal Authorities (http://www.law.ox.ac.uk/published/OSCOLA_4th_edn.pdf).
- Plagiarism: Plagiarism means that somebody uses material, which was written by somebody else, for one's own work without appropriate citation. Plagiarizing is an illegal activity. Guidelines for Seminar Papers

- ⇒ Length of the seminar paper: minimum of 50,000 characters (text only, including footnotes and blank characters).
- ⇒ All seminar papers must have a table of contents (including pages numbers), a list of abbreviations, and a bibliography.
- ⇒ All used sources including court rulings shall be cited in footnotes.
- ⇒ White DIN A4 paper.
- ⇒ Page format recommendations:
 - top: 3 cm
 - bottom: 3 cm
 - left: 3,5 cm
 - right: 2 cm
 - page numbers: 1,5 cm from the top or from the bottom
- ⇒ Line spacing:

- Text: line spacing of 1,5.
- For longer quotations in the text and footnotes: single spaced (line spacing of 1,0).

⇒ Size of letters:

- Text: 12 pt.
- Footnotes: 10 pt.

⇒ Please use page numbers for all pages.
